I had the privilege last Thursday afternoon of attending the presentation of the Sheila Mears Award for Art and Literature at the Grafton Regional Gallery. Dr Peter Mears judged and presented the awards with first place going to Georgia Patterson. The afternoon was supported by performances from our school band and choir. I would again like to thank the Mears family for their kind sponsorship of this award and their ongoing support for literature and the arts at Grafton High School.

Final P&C Meeting for 2013

The final P&C meeting for 2013 will be held at 7:00 pm this Thursday 28th November in the staff common room. All parents are welcome.

School Budget Facts and Figures

As promised last week, I have included below a brief summary of key aspects of the school budget for 2014.

- Over \$130,000 towards teacher professional learning, with the majority focussed on collegial learning in the classroom, focussed directly on improving classroom practice.
- Over \$136,000 for faculty budgets towards resources and consumables for courses.
- Up to \$100,000 towards completion of the mezzanine dance area, gym equipment and landscaping for the High Performance Sports Centre.
- Over \$22,000 contributed by the P&C towards textbooks for the Australian Curriculum.
- Over \$74,000 towards technology equipment, plus funding for the employment of a full time technician.
- Over \$17,000 for Library resources.
- \$5,000 to support the school band and choir.
- Almost \$40,000 for the Djehuti Math Numeracy program
- Over \$150,000 towards Literacy programs.
- More than \$265,000 towards programs for Indigenous students, students with disabilities and students requiring additional learning support.

Without buying into the political debate I do have to mention that this significant increase in funding is due to the Gonski reforms and agreement between state and federal government. It was reassuring to hear the very public support for this funding from the NSW Premier and NSW Minister for Education.


