### **Principals Report**

Welcome back to staff, students and parents. As we begin term four, the final stage of schooling for our Year 12 students. I would like to wish our Year 12 students all the best with their HSC exams and whatever future endeavours they choose to pursue.

One HSC student who has already excelled is our outgoing School Captain – Candice Ingram. Candice has been nominated to be considered for "Callback 2016" for her HSC Major Study Performance for Dance. "Callback" is a selection of outstanding performances and Film and Technology projects from HSC Dance students. It is managed by the Arts Unit, NSW Department of Education, and is held at the Seymour Centre in Sydney. This is an outstanding achievement for Candice and I hope that her performance will make the final cut.

While I am on the topic of high achieving students, I would also like to acknowledge one of our high performing teachers. Congratulations to Mr Moar for his nomination for a World Teachers' Day Citation to be awarded by Professor Lynch from Southern Cross University on behalf of the Australian College of Educators. Mr Moar's award particularly acknowledges his leadership across the school in digital learning.

### **Centenary Scholarship**

As part of our school's centenary celebrations in 2012, money was raised to go towards a perpetual award of \$1,000 to be presented to a single Year 11 student each year as they move into their HSC year. Please note that applications are processed centrally by the Department of Education, not locally at the school. # Yr 9 Agriculture Excursion to Costa Berry Farm

On the 7th September Grafton High School's Year 9 Agriculture class went on a tour of the Costa Berry farm at Corindi. Costa is the largest horticultural company in Australia. The National Manager of Berry Production and Harvest, Mr Parsons was kind enough to take time out of his busy schedule to personally provide the tour.

We picked up Mr Parson and began the tour by travelling to the raspberry block. Awaiting us were Belinda and Jess to talk about the production of raspberries. This included information on the benefits of the substrate growing process in a warmer climate. We learned about the pests and diseases that are managed to produce high quality fruit. After a brief walk around and taste test it was back on the bus to the blueberries.

Waiting for us at the blueberries was Mel, who provided us with information on the production and management of diseases affecting blueberries. The first blueberries viewed were grown using the substrate process. We were told that in a year there would be many tonnes of blueberries produced. The class was then allowed to pick a few blueberries before being led to the rabbiteye blueberries which were grown in ground and were around eleven years old on that block. The final part of the tour was a walk through the packing shed which was very interesting and cold! They also keep plants inside the cold rooms. When they pull the plants out, the plants think they are in spring and produce fruit. This process extends the harvesting season.

It was great to hear that more of the berries would be exported as production increased in this area. This will provide more employment opportunities doing a wide range of jobs at the business.

We want to thank Mr Parsons of Costas for the tour and the free fruit:) It was a very enjoyable and interesting excursion.

### 2016 Jacaranda Letter to Parents

Dear Parent/Caregiver

We have been advised that "Jacaranda Thursday" will be a half-day public holiday day this year. It is an important community event which many of our families enjoy each year.

This means that Grafton High School will be open until 1:00 pm on the Thursday of the Jacaranda week (Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> November). However, we have been informed that all organised activities on the day occur in the first half of the day and so acknowledge that many students and their families will still want to participate in those events. Based on attendance patterns in previous years, we have found that very few students attend school on this day. Whilst the school will be open for the morning, it is not possible to run normal lessons and routine with so few students in attendance. As such, the school will only be maintaining general supervision of any students who attend school for the morning, while staff utilise the time to participate in mandatory CPR and Anaphylaxis training. Any students who attend school in the morning will be required to stay at school until 1:00 pm, unless parents sign them out of school, as per normal school procedure.

To assist parents/carers, you can complete, detach and return the note below if your child **will not** be attending school on Jacaranda Thursday (Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> November). This note will be sufficient to explain your child's absence on the day.

I would remind parents of their responsibility for the care and supervision of their children if they are absent on the day or, if they attend school in the morning, once they have left school at 1:00 pm.

We look forward to a safe and enjoyable Jacaranda festival and thank you for your understanding and cooperation.
