Principal's Report

As many of you would have seen in the Daily Examiner, we were extremely fortunate to have Dr Harvey Cohen visit the school recently. Dr Cohen presented the school with an antenna that his wife, Dr Elizabeth Essex-Cohen used in her work which was part of the development of GPS that we know and use today.

Dr Essex-Cohen was a world renowned physicist and her work is widely recognised in the science field. In the coming months we will be mounting a plaque beneath the antenna to inform students of its importance and links to Dr Essex-Cohen as an ex student of Grafton High School.

I would like to thank Dr Harvey Cohen for his generosity, not only with the antenna but also his time spent with students passing on his knowledge of the history and development of this technology.



NAPLAN online

During week 9 of this term all students in Years 7 and 9 will participate in the NAPLAN Online trial. This trial will see students complete the test using a laptop computer. NAPLAN Online will provide better assessment, more precise results and faster turnaround of information. Assessments will use an adaptive 'tailored test design', which gives students questions better suited to their achievement level. This form of testing will help teachers customise their teaching more specifically to student needs.

Further information regarding this will be provided to students and parents prior to the trial.

Tell Them From Me

Grafton High has participated in the Tell Them From Me survey for several years and students in all years will complete this again in the coming weeks. This survey provides us with direct feedback on key areas within the school. During this survey period we will be asking that parents also participate in a Parent version. 



Featured Author

In the early days of his writing career, Joseph Delaney worked as a teacher at a Sixth Form College and prior to that was employed as an engineer. Joseph is now a full-time writer living in Lancashire, in the heart of Boggart territory. He first got the idea for the Wardstone Chronicles series when he moved to the village where he now lives and discovered there was a local 'boggart'.

He made a note in his notebook 'a story about a man who hunts boggarts' and years later, when he had to come up with an idea at short notice, developed this into 'The Spook's Apprentice', the first book in the series.

He continues to draw upon the folklore of Lancashire and has acquired much local knowledge over the years which he tweaks and modifies to create his fictional world. Another source of inspiration has been Lancashire's varied and atmospheric landscape.

Joseph describes his method of writing as a process of discovery. He doesn't plot too far ahead and often doesn't know what is going to happen until he writes it down. In other words he makes it up as he goes along. He prefers writing dialogue to description, in which he says he is a minimalist and leaves much to the reader's imagination.


