Years 8-10 Selective Class placements 2019

Application forms are now available online for student placement in selective classes for 2019. This is a state-wide process for all selective and partially selective high schools. Applications are returned to the school front office and close on Friday 27 July. The outcome of this process is normally communicated to parents late August or early September.

The school currently only has room for placements in Years 9 and 10 in 2019. Years 7 and 8 will be full. The application assessment criteria and the supporting documentation required are explained on the school website:

For your reference, the criteria for selection relate to exceptional academic performance across three areas:

- English
- Mathematics
- Problem Solving

Copies of the following types of evidence should be attached to an application:

- Most recent yearly school academic report and half-yearly academic report
- Most recent NAPLAN results (summary page with achievement bands in each of the assessment strands)
- Other recent evidence of excellence in academic performance (such as awards or achievement in external academic competitions and testing)

Subject and School Contributions

A reminder to parents that we still have a number of students with outstanding financial contributions. These include the Voluntary School Contribution as well as contributions for individual practical subjects. Whilst the school contribution is not mandatory, the subject contributions pay for the consumable items your child uses in a practical subject. Without payment of the subject contribution, we cannot continue to supply a student with consumable materials and they need to be given alternative, nonpractical tasks to complete. Parents experiencing genuine financial difficulty are encouraged to apply for an exemption from subject contributions. The form for this can be obtained from the school front office. Your assistance in this is greatly appreciated.

Anti-Racism Contact officer (ARCO)

The NSW Department of Education's Anti-Racism Policy constitutes a no-tolerance attitude for racism in NSW public schools. To ensure this, every public school is required to have a trained Anti-Racism Complaint Officer (ARCO) to attend to any complaints of racism by students, staff or parents. Grafton High's ARCO for 2018 is also the school Student Support Officer, Nikki Davies.

The role of ARCO and the Department's Anti-Racism Policy is not simply about addressing complaints if and when they arise, it is also about recognising the intent and impact of racism on educational outcomes, individual happiness and selfconfidence, school climate, cultural identity. school and community relations and student behaviour. It is about understanding that perpetuating a culture of silence and denial that racism occurs simply normalises inappropriate and unacceptable behaviour. Breaking the cycle of silence and denial is a crucial first step in rejecting racism and building the confidence of all members of our school community.

Students and staff can make complaints in relation to racism, on their own or on someone else's behalf, directly to the ARCO. A process of investigating, managing and resolving the complaint is then initiated. Complaints may be managed informally (by the ARCO) or formally (by executive staff) depending on the nature of the complaint and/or who it involves.

Anyone who feels they are experiencing racism at school is encouraged to contact Nikki Davies. Nikki is located in the learning loft at the top of the school library.
