Staffing Shortage Challenges

As you may be aware, we have struggled at times this term to staff some classes and lessons due to a state-wide shortage of available temporary and casual teaching staff, and lack of staff available for appointment in some specific subject areas. We have continued to pursue creative solutions to maintain some meaningful learning activities during periods of time where classes need to be collapsed and supervised together, and we thank students for their cooperative and responsible behaviour during this time. We are continuing the search for suitably skilled permanent, temporary and casual staff within the parameters of the NSW Department of Education recruitment processes to provide stability in the learning environment for all our students.

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Improving Student Outcomes

As we move into second semester, I urge all families to continue to use measures such as our fortnightly summaries to actively discuss and have a genuine interest in learning and school activities. This is proven by research to improve student engagement and educational outcomes. We also intend to continue to improve our attendance rates across all year groups, increasing the proportion of students attending 90% of the time or more.

I hope all students and families are able to enjoy a restful break and find time to spend together, and look forward to an equally successful second semester in 2021.

Health Industry Visit

Thirteen students enjoyed visiting local Health industries on Tuesday 25 May to learn more about what's involved in working in these industries. Students visited Caringa and learnt about patron welfare and support, Clarence Village where they learnt about aged care, and Country Universities Centre Clarence Valley where they developed an awareness of local careers available in the Health industry.



Students enjoyed the excursion and were keen to enter a future career in the Health industry by the end of the day, and many students were interested in undertaking school Work Experience with the industries visited. The excursion was organised and funded by the Educational Pathways Pilot Program (EPPP) operating at our school this year to ensure students leave school well prepared for higher education, training or work.













EPPP Novaskill Construction Pre-Apprenticeship Program

Eleven students from three Grafton Cluster Educational Pathways Pilot Program (EPPP) schools, including Grafton High School Year 10 and 11 students Adrion Gibson, Keaton Roe, Oliver Tully and Taj O'Mahony undertook an EPPP Novaskill Construction Pre-Apprenticeship program at South Grafton High School last month. The free skills program ran for 8 days over 4 weeks, plus 1 week of work placement.

Students developed skills and knowledge to demonstrate competencies in the nationally recognised units of 'Apply OHS requirements, policies and procedures in the construction industry', 'Carry out measurements and calculations', 'Read and interpret plans and specifications' and 'Conduct workplace communication'. These units contribute to the Certificate II in Construction Pathways qualification.

Other areas of skill development during the course include team work, time management, leadership, planning, use of technology in the industry, and networking with students from other schools and employers. Students also undertook practical experience where they constructed and assembled a timber picnic table that was donated back to the host school. The course included training and assessment plus 1 day of Careers development including mock interviews, industry aptitude testing, and developing a resume. The Construction Course was offered to students for free as part of the NSW Department of Education Educational Pathways Pilot Program (EPPP) operating at Grafton High School.


