2021 Centenary Scholarship – HSC Students

As part of our school's centenary celebrations in 2012, money was raised to go towards a perpetual award for students. The school P&C has added sufficient commitments to ensure that a fund can be established to allow an award of \$1,000 to be presented to a single student each year.

The establishment of a High School in Grafton more than 100 years ago was born from a desire for local students to have the opportunity to further their education beyond normal finishing age in a local school. As such, after consultation with the school P&C and executive staff, it was decided that this award would be named the Centenary Scholarship and that it would be awarded each year to a Year 11 student, to support them furthering their education from Year 11 to 12, and beyond.

This scholarship will be awarded to a single student at the end of year awards night.

Any student wishing to nominate themselves for this award is asked to submit a written application that addresses the spirit of the scholarship, by outlining what personal goals they have for Year 12 and when they leave school, and how the scholarship will help them towards achieving those goals. All applications are limited to a maximum of two A4 pages. Applications are due to the Principal no later than 3:15 pm on Friday November 19, 2021.

Oliver Westman (Year 12):

Oliver has had a busy HSC year. He was elected School Captain and was given the honour of delivering the student's speech at the ANZAC Day Commemoration Ceremony at Memorial Park. Oliver's academic commitment and success has been rewarded with early entry offers to several universities for 2022 including University of Wollongong, University of Technology Sydney, Macquarie University, and Australian National University. Oliver intends on studying law and has ambitions of entering politics. 
