Year 12 Study Day

On Friday 18 February, Year 12 took part in a Study Day, designed to refocus their efforts as they push forwards through their final year of schooling onto their HSC Examinations. Students took part in three sessions run by school staff. Mrs Piper (Careers Adviser) and Mr Yong (Assistant Year Adviser) guided the students through NESA requirements, Ms Bell (School Counsellor) and Ms Davies (Students Support Officer) provided the students with strategies and information to help them maintain their mental health and wellbeing through what can be a stressful and overwhelming time in a student's life. Mrs Martin (Head Teacher Teaching and Learning) led the students through some reflective practice, asking students to honestly assess themselves as 'effective learners' along with providing the students with strategies to help with their time management and organisation, and suggestions for revision. Students were able to get active and bond as a group as they took part in a competitive game of Dodge Ball, before engaging with a guest speaker from Elevate Education, whose seminars and workshops help students improve their study techniques, increase motivation, build confidence and lift exam performance.



Sentral Parent Portal

Recently, parents and carers were emailed with information and instructions explaining the 'Parent Portal Access Key Registration'. This provides parents and carers with access to the Sentral Parent Portal which includes discreet information about each student's progress in our school. This system is also used to create bookings for Parent-Teacher Interviews when these events occur. Attendance Matters at Grafton High School

As part of our High Expectations here at Grafton High School, we are focusing on student attendance. A new initiative has been put in place to improve student attendance and to make students and parents/carers aware of the importance of student attendance on a successful education. All parents/carers will be receiving a letter that identifies their child's attendance rate and days absent as well as information around what being absent means for the child and their education. These will be sent via e-mail, during Week 1 and Week 6 of every term. If you have any questions, please contact the school and ask to speak to the Attendance Team.



Attendance Procedures at Grafton High School

Students must by law attend school each day it is open. If students are unable to attend for some reason, then the following procedures should be followed:

A Parent/Carer should notify the school by telephone, email, or fax before 10:00 am on the day of absence to prevent an SMS or letter being sent home. Following an absence from school, a verbal or written explanation must be provided within 7 days. Alternatively, a parent/carer can respond to the absence notification text.

Principals may decline to accept an explanation that you have provided if they do not believe the absence is in the best interest of your child. In these circumstances your child's absence would be recorded as unjustified.

Written explanation notes should be handed in at the Attendance Window which is at the Front Office. Notes must clearly state: student's full given name and surname, year, date or dates absent, reason for absence and signed by parent or guardian.

NB: There is a form available from school (see below). This form ensures all necessary information is included and assists in the filing of notes. Please use it whenever possible.

If a student is going to be absent for any day please notify the school. This can be done by:

- Emailing the School grafton-h.school@det.nsw.edu.au
- Delivering or sending a note to the Attendance Window at the Front Office.

If a student is to be absent for an extended period, parents need to apply for an exemption from attendance through the Front Office. Supporting documentation will be required.

Students who arrive late to school must report to the Attendance Window, preferably with a note from their parent/carer stating the reason for being late. They will then be issued with a Late Arrival slip. Students will not be admitted to class unless they produce this Late Arrival slip.

Students who wish to leave the school during the day must bring a note from home requesting permission to do so. This note must be submitted before school, at recess or lunch before the pass out can be issued. Students must be signed out at the Attendance Window before leaving and signed in at the Attendance Window when they return to school.

The procedures outlined are designed for the safety and welfare of all students, to reduce the level of truancy and to assist the running of the school.

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Assessment Booklets and Planners

During Week 4, students in Years 7 to 10 received their Assessment Booklets and an Assessment Planner designed to help students organise themselves and improve their time management so that they are able to better prepare for tests and assignments. During Home Room lessons, students were taken through the assessment procedures at Grafton High School and were given an opportunity to transfer assignments and tests from their Assessment Booklet to their Assessment Planner. Students are encouraged to display their Assessment Planner somewhere at home as a visual reminder of the assessments they have coming up and use the Assessment Booklets for further detail. We encourage parents and carers to discuss this with their child/children and if any students have not received an Assessment Booklet or Assessment Planner, they are asked to see their Home Room teacher for a copy of each.


NSW Combined High Schools (CHS) Rowing Championships

GHS Civil Construction Pre-Apprenticeship Course

Year 12 Grafton High School student Tyrone Wilson recently completed a 5-day Civil Construction Pre-Traineeship skills course with Yalagan Group Training where he obtained his Construction Industry White Card, Work Safely at Heights licence, Operate Elevating Work Platform licence (Yellow Card) and License to Operate a Forklift Truck and got a general 'taste' of life working in the construction industry. Tyrone said he enjoyed the course, particularly being able to obtain his construction industry licences, which he hopes will come in handy when he finishes school and embarks on his career pathway to undertake a trade. "My favourite part was operating the forklift and elevating work platform. The course will help me find a career and give me a better opportunity of getting a job." The civil construction course was offered for free and funded by the Educational Pathways Pilot Program (EPPP) operating at our school.
