GRAFTON AND SOUTH GRAFTON HIGH SCHOOLS MANUFACTURING INDUSTRY VISIT DAY

A group of Year 10 students from both Grafton HS and South Grafton HS enjoyed visiting several manufacturing industry businesses on Thursday 4 August. The students learnt about future job opportunities and listened to presentations from staff at each site. Subway for lunch was also a hit! The full-day excursion saw students visit Wicks and Parker Townsend, Yamba Welding & Engineering, and the Yamba TAFE Connected Learning Centre. The free excursion was funded by the Regional Industry Education Partnerships (RIEP) and Educational Pathways Program (EPP) operating at our school this year to ensure students leave school well prepared for higher education, training or work.

Anthony Wicks and Karina Turner guided the students through the Wicks & Parker Townsend facility demonstrating their heavy manufacturing activities and varied careers within the business. Anthony spoke of the need for a keen interest in the industry and show an interest for learning new skills and developing employability skills. He talked about how many of his staff are multi qualified to ensure sustainability within the business.

Yamba Welding & Engineering took the students on a journey through their process from raw materials to an impressive vessel used by many clients like, the defence force, Border patrol, Police and the local fishing industry. Trent and Nathan explained to the students the processes and skills required for the manufacturing of this vessels. They moved the students through the workshop then onto Yamba Marina where students were given a guided tour of their latest projects. Here Nathan & Trent discussed the types of jobs and careers opportunities at YWE and Trent explained his career pathways that he took from subject undertaken at school to where he is at YWE.

Yamba TAFE Connected Learning Centre offered their facilities for the group to sit and enjoy a Subway lunch. Here the students could see first hand the resources and facilities; including the mobile learning unit that currently is in location. After lunch, the students were treated to a tour of the facility by Melissa Moss; TAFE Services Coordinator where they had an opportunity to experience some Virtual Reality activities.

Thanks to Jill McCall; Senior Project Officer, Regional Industry Education Partnerships, Training Services NSW, Rachel Copeland; Educational Pathways Program, SBAT Engagement Officer, for their attendance on the day. They both had the opportunity to meet and discuss career pathways with the students throughout the day.
