COVID-19 and RATs

When students and staff should take a rapid antigen test (RAT)

Students and staff should use the RATs supplied to them in the following circumstances:

When showing COVID-19 symptoms

Any student or member of staff who develops even the mildest of COVID-19 symptoms should get tested for COVID - 19. Symptomatic students and staff should use a RAT or get a PCR (throat and nose swab) test and not attend school or work until they are symptom free. We have Rapid Antigen Tests (RAT) available for student to collect from the Administration Office if required.

Refer to the NSW Government's Rapid Antigen tests for COVID-19 and Testing positive to COVID-19 fact sheets for guidance on what to do if you receive a positive RAT or if symptoms persist.

When they believe they have been exposed to COVID-19

Anyone who believes they have been exposed to COVID-19 is strongly recommended to monitor for symptoms and test if they have any concerns.

Refer to the NSW Government's Advice for people exposed to COVID-19 for further information and advice.

Before large gatherings and higher risk activities

School s are advised to consider ordering and distributing RATs ahead of large gatherings and higher risk activities, including school camps, discos and formals, and tests and exams as a COVID safe measure to support the safety of students and staff.

Support on administering the tests

All RAT kits contain instructions on how to use the tests, check results and dispose of the tests safely. Parents, carers and staff can also download user guides of the relevant test they have received through the Therapeutic Goods Administration website. The user guides contain a contact number for the suppliers for additional support. People using saliva testing kits must not eat or drink for 30 minutes before taking the saliva RAT, to give more accurate results. Schools are not required to support students in administering the tests.

School Ambulance Cover Scheme

The School Ambulance Cover Scheme covers the cost of an ambulance for students who have an accident or fall ill while at school or when on an organised school excursion or activity. [Please note that travel to Qld for excursions are not covered.]

If you receive an invoice from NSW Ambulance for your child who has fallen ill or been injured on a school excursion, please drop the invoice in to the Front office, who will arrange to make the payment.
