

#### Educational Pathways Program (EPP)

Apprenticeship & Traineeship Head Start Initiative – National Timber & Hardware Association

As part of the EPP being delivered at our school, 12 students from across the EPP Grafton Group undertook an innovative training program to improve education and career outcomes.

The EPP 'Apprenticeship and Traineeship Head Start' Initiative had students undertake preapprenticeship skills training with NTHA Group Training Organisation with a focus on the timber & hardware industry. Students who completed the training program developed skills and knowledge across four units of competency and an understanding from the design and manufacturing process all the way through to products being in the trade customer's hand. This training included practical activities and assessment before students were deemed competent and gained the qualification from the training company. Students also undertook an industry visit to Williams Group Australia in South Grafton. Here they spoke with the Branch Manager, HR Manager and CEO. Students heard firsthand what is expected in the industry and what they would be looking for from a young employee.

The group enjoyed lunch provided by Williams Group before touring the facility and experiencing the variety of materials, tools, and equipment. This was an important and valuable component of the program and will give students an advantage when applying for future apprenticeships. On the final day students were presented with a certificate of their achievement and were given career guidance by NTHA specialist staff preparing them for the next step in their career journey.

This free course was funded by the EPP operating at our school to ensure students leave school well prepared for higher education, training, or employment.





#### Apprenticeship & Traineeship Head Start Initiative - Aged Care Industry

As part of the EPP, Novaskill delivered the pre-traineeship skills course in the community services industry (aged care) to 12 students recently. The students undertook training at Mareeba Age Care over the 8 days.

The course was designed to introduce students to the specialised skills required in supporting the most vulnerable in our community.

The program had students interact with staff and residents of Mareeba Aged Care whilst undertaking training and assessment in 3 units of competencies.

Over the course of the training Mareeba Aged Care and Novaskill identified potential students that would be suited to future school-based traineeships (SBAT). Novaskill gave these students valuable skills that developed their abilities in following their chosen career pathway.



#### Workplace Industry Excursion

Congratulations to the Year 9 students who recently completed their construction White Card course.

The Year 9 students took part in a workplace industry day excursion. The day began at the Transport NSW depot, where the students gained valuable insights into a range of career options in the roads and transport industry. Following this, the group went to the Grafton TAFE campus, where they were given a guided tour around the campus, with a focus on career and study options in the electrical, refrigeration and automotive industry. The day concluded with a talk at the Essential Energy depot and a trip to their Grafton training facility.


