
# Newsletter Grafton High School



### From the Principal's Desk

Welcome back to the newsletter for 2023!

You will have noticed the break in newsletters this year. While we have continued to celebrate positive news on our Facebook page, after a few changes in staffing, we have not managed to release a newsletter in quite a few months, and I am sorry about that. In a digital age, I believe this form of newsletter still has an important role in both providing a compiled set of information for our community, as well as providing an important snapshot in time for future reference. Our intention is to release a newsletter such as this twice per term, at the end of Week 5 and the end of Week 10. You will see continued within this that while the year is going quickly, there are plenty of positive things going on at Grafton High School for our students.

After much work behind the scenes, our long awaited construction work upgrading our site is nearing completion, with the junior toilet block upgrade happening at the time of writing. This will hopefully be completed by the end of this term. We have had paint and carpet works completed across most of the school, bringing a renewed sense to our learning environments. We should also see a new bell system installed in September, which will improve both our daily functions and our safety features on site.

Our school also underwent a process called External Validation at the start of this term, which occurs once every four years, and required our school to make a detailed submission to a panel of external principals and leaders, including the Director, Educational Leadership for our network. The purpose of this process is to rate our work in the areas of learning, teaching and leading, with reference to the School Excellence Framework developed by the NSW Department of Education. Our school received very positive feedback on many of the initiatives we have been implementing in recent years, and this process will shape the aspects of our school, and the directions that we continue to work on in the coming years. I will refer more to this process of school planning and improvement in the coming months and years. In the meantime, please enjoy reading about the wonderful things that happen here at our school!







### Northern Rivers Careers Expo & Post School Options Expo

Students were given the opportunity to attend career expos this term with support from the Educational Pathways Program. Years 10 & 11 students travelled to Lismore for the Northern Rivers Career Expo where they experienced hands-on activities with TAFE 'Try-a-Trade' sessions, a school cook off competition and many industry experiences. Students had an opportunity to talk with industry representatives from many different career areas - the defence force, police & emergency services, universities, TAFE & registered training organisations, employment agencies, local businesses, and government departments. These students left the expo with practical skills and knowledge to help in their career options and future directions.

Year 12 students attended the Coffs Clarence Post School Options Career Expo where they also had the opportunity to discuss with universities, employers, training providers, TAFE and employment agencies their future pathways and learn about the variety of post school vocational options. This event was also supported by the Educational Pathways Program.







### NSW Training Awards Ambassador Visit

On 28 June a group of students from year 10 had the opportunity to listen to Jordan Peterson a NSW Training Awards Ambassador about his career journey and the advantages of choosing a vocational education pathway. Jordan talked about his struggles through school until he started his vocational pathway by selecting a VET subject in Year 11. This took him into his first apprenticeship and built the foundations of a successful career.

This event was organised by the Careers team and provided by the Educational Pathways Program (EPP) operating at our school this year to ensure students leave school well prepared for higher education, training or work.

On Friday 21 July our Year 10 students were lucky enough to have 14 professionals from our community visit Grafton High School and participate in Year 10 career talks. This was an opportunity for students to gain information directly from those working in a range of different careers.




### Year 11 VET Primary Industries work placement
