FROM THE PRINCIPALS DESK

Term 4 is disappearing quickly, and we are as busy as ever at Grafton HS. End of year activities and arrangements are in full swing, and planning for 2024 is well underway. Year 12 have completed their exams, and we enjoyed a wonderful evening of celebrations at the formal last week. Congratulations to the whole year group, and their year advisors Karla Hubbard and Erin Taylor for finishing the year in style. We welcomed our new Teacher-Libarian to the school at the start of the term, Lorette Hargreaves. She brings new ideas to the role and to the school, and students should look forward to these.

As we look to 2024, our school day structure will change. After a comprehensive process earlier in the year, we will be moving to a 5 period day (instead of 6), with longer periods. In 2024, the school day will start at 9am, and finish at 3:10pm. This will not change any arrangements with bus travel, as it is very similar to our current arrangements. We have made some other changes to the structure of our curriculum, all in the pursuit of better learning and brighter futures for our students. We believe that based on our process, research and consultation, that the longer period length will allow deeper learning, and less movement and disruption across the school. We have also increased the time allocated to core subjects in Year 8, removing the minielective. The evidence clearly tells us that building better core skills in the early years, leads to greater outcomes in the later years of high school, no matter the chosen career path. I am confident that our decisions are setting the foundations for greater success for students of Grafton High School into the future.

I am aware of the pressures on our community at the minute, with many families experiencing the impacts of the rising cost of living we are seeing across many of our essential needs. Our students need to be set up for success by having the right learning equipment, belong to our school by wearing our school uniform, and have their nutritional needs met by eating quality food to provide the energy for learning. As we look to 2024, it is timely to remind all families that if you need assistance in the provision of food, learning equipment or uniforms, please contact our office. Our breakfast club operates on Monday, Wednesday and Friday mornings, along with other arrangements for food and materials throughout the day. For uniforms, subject fees and book packs, we have a brief student assistance application process that is simple and confidential and will be a real help to some families at this time. A final reminder that the last day for students is Friday 14th December. While I'm sure the next 5 weeks will go quite quickly, there is plenty to enjoy and look forward to, such as our rewards excurions, activities week, and other end of year festivities.


AGRICULTURE TECHNOLOGY


We had the privilege of our Jacaranda King, Toby Powers attend GHS as a special guest at our school assembly and present the beautiful trophy that was made by the TAS staff.
